Must-know knowledge

William Morris (1834-1896) was one of the most influential designers of the 19th century. His work included wallpaper design and print, furniture, stained glass windows, tiles and tapestries. He was also a writer and campaigner for environmental and social change.

By the mid-1860s, William Morris concentrated on designing wallpaper. His patterns were inspired by the natural world.

His most well– known designs were floral patterns that could be repeated many times by block printing techniques on large pieces of paper to make patterned wallpaper.

Printing techniques were later improve through advances in technology, using printing machines and synthetic coloured inks.

In April 1861, Morris, Marshall, Faulker & Co, was established and it produced a range of original domestic furnishings, layering images and adding patterns and colour.
